The Region 3 Office of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) has received a Mined Land Reclamation application for permit modification for the above-referenced Mined Land Reclamation permit in the Town of Fallsburgh, Sullivan County as well as an application for a new State Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (SPDES) permit.

The Department previously coordinated for Lead Agency in 2013 for the proposed expansion of the mine by 7 acres, but as the project has substantially changed both in acreage of the expansion and through the addition of a wastewater discharge, DEC is recoordinating for the revised project.

A copy of the Mined Land Reclamation application, SPDES application, full Environmental Assessment Form (EAF), and a SEQR Coordination Data Sheet outlining the details of the proposed project are enclosed for review.

The purpose of this request is to determine, under Article 8 (State Environmental Quality Review: SEQR) of the Environmental Conservation Law (ECL) and 6 NYCRR Part 617, the following:

- 1. Your jurisdiction in the action described in the enclosed documents;
- 2. Your interest in acting as Lead Agency; and
- 3. Issues of concern which you believe should be evaluated.

The Lead Agency must determine the need for an environmental impact statement (EIS) on this project. Please provide your response to the above items <u>within 30 days</u> of the date of this letter. If no response is received, we will assume you have no interest in being Lead Agency and the DEC will serve as the Lead Agency. The application is currently incomplete until a Determination of Significance has been made by the Lead Agency.

# Project Description:

Riato Stone LLC is proposing to expand the Life of Mine (LOM) an additional 15.3 acres, for a total LOM of 33.5 acres, for additional excavation of 20,000 cubic yards of sand and gravel over approximately 20 years. Processing is proposed to continue in the same area as currently used. The application also includes two outfalls to be covered by an individual State Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (SPDES) permit, Outfall 001 (stormwater<sup>1</sup>) and Outfall 002 (stormwater and process water).

## **DEC Region 3 Position:**

Region 3 is considering whether DEC or a local agency would be most appropriate to serve as the lead agency for the review of this action.
